Sharon has been an active member of DSLSC since 2004, also serving with dedication at North Burleigh and Mullaloo surf clubs. A testament to her resilience, Sharon took on the role of organising the Darwin Ocean Swim following the sudden passing of her husband during the 2021 event. Her efforts in relocating and managing this swim, the only organised ocean event in the Northern Territory, have received strong community support, highlighting her dedication to both the club and local open-water swimmers.

To increase patrol numbers, Sharon introduced the Bronze Observer Award, allowing members to contribute while awaiting full Bronze certification, which has successfully boosted patrol participation. Her unwavering commitment is also evident in her regular attendance at club meetings, even when travelling, ensuring she remains connected to club activities.

Sharon's hands-on involvement in running Nippers and the weekly Nipper BBQ promotes community spirit and camaraderie, especially among younger members. Her exceptional dedication to volunteering strengthens her club, inspires members, and builds a supportive, connected community.

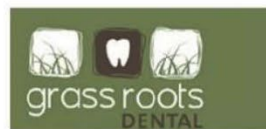

President’s Message

It is my pleasure to present the 2024/2025 Annual Report for Darwin Surf Life Saving Club. On behalf of the Board and leadership team, I extend our gratitude to members, staff and supporters for your dedication to surf lifesaving and ensuring the safety of our beach community.

As a club, we need to be more proactive around some of our activities. Ten members chosen to represent the range of club activities participated in a Visioning and Planning morning in November. As a direct result of ideas raised on the day, we have made key communication changes for current and aspiring members.

Member Recognition

Sharon Stewart won the DHL Volunteer of the Year at the SLSA awards, recognizing her outstanding contributions to nippers, education, and the Darwin Ocean Swim. Congratulations to Sharon who is a key member of our club.

Active Members

We successfully implemented a volunteer roster system to give our members more choice and autonomy. Most members found it easier to do more hours as they are able to fit patrols around their family and social life. We saw a 21% increase in active members which we were thrilled about. Introducing the Bronze Observer Award has created a stepping stone for eager volunteers and this initiative will help more new members contribute sooner and stay engaged and social in the club.

Nippers

Our nipper numbers have continued to drop and stood at 52 despite having the engaging Kate Low as Nipper Coordinator.



We have planned earlier notifications to schools and an earlier sign on day at Casuarina swimming pool to engage families sooner in the year. Following on from this we have programmed weekly swimming lessons staffed by qualified members Amanda Bagley and JoJo Wreford commencing early March and through pre-season. This will enable both nippers, aspiring bronze medallion participants and current proficiency holders to sharpen up their swimming skills. We hope these swimming sessions will make our season longer and more attractive to new and current nipper families.

Competitions

Our team of nine competitors participated in the NT Championships in Nhulunbuy and joined in the celebrations for Gove Surf Life Saving Club's 50th Anniversary. Despite placing third overall, several of our athletes won their age group.

The Darwin Ocean Swim, sponsored by Macarthur River Mining, was a great success thanks to Sharon Stewart, Andrew McGuiness, Sam Creek, the water safety team and all the active members on the ground crew.

Lease Agreement

We've received a draft letter of offer for a 40-year crown lease agreement, including both the old lease and the new parcel of land for car parking. At the time of this report, we are seeking legal counsel, and I have spoken to Minister Josh Burgoyne about the current draft and some amendments we would like to make. We hope to bring a draft letter of offer to the members to consider in the coming months. As a Board, we are keen to be able to move forward with this.

Beach Accessibility

Partnering with CDU Occupational Therapy students, we've developed a plan to improve our disability support program, focussing on beach accessibility for wheelchair users. The report is a great starting point, and we will be seeking more

support to take the outlined improvements to the club processes which will make the program easier to implement.

Our Direction

Nightcliff Beach remains the most popular among the community and patrolling members. SLSNT commenced a lifeguard service, and when combining data, we see that over 15,000 swimmers have been counted. As a club, we are working towards establishing a permanent presence at Nightcliff in collaboration with SLSNT.

Once we have secured the lease, we hope to focus on an exciting infrastructure plan that will enable us to be a hub of safe family water fun and a more attractive meal destination for families and nature lovers all year round.

Lastly, thank you to our Board members for their leadership and to all our sponsors for their continued support. Please refer to the list of sponsors on page 9 and our Board Members on page 11.

Director of Surf Life Saving Report

The club had a successful dry season and conducted patrols as usual at Casuarina Beach on Sunday mornings (also assisting with water safety for Nippers) and Nightcliff Beach. The Club also conducted patrols on Sunday afternoons at both beaches if the tide was up. This meant that there were often morning and afternoon patrols at both beaches. The recorded attendance at both beaches during club patrol hours was 6296 persons in total with 1476 swimmers, 388 craft and 4432 on beach. There were 59 active adult and 9 active junior patrol members, as well as active life members. Nightcliff continues to be the most popular beach for swimming.

There were two recorded rescues of children from between the flags, nine recorded instances of First Aid including minor cuts, abrasions and one minor marine sting. One person required an ambulance. There were 11 preventative actions conducted.

A number of patrols utilised the SLS Operations App in addition to filling out the traditional paper patrol log. This enabled patrol information and member patrol hours to be instantly updated in the Surfguard system thereby reducing the administrative burden. The quality of some patrol reports could be improved with a small number of instances where a report was not provided, or data was incomplete.

This year the Club trialled a new method of compiling the patrol roster with members accessing the roster on google docs and volunteering for specific dates and locations. The usual practice has been to form Patrol Teams at the start of the season and allocate dates for each team for the whole season at the beginning of the season in May. The patrol captain would then manage the attendance of their team members.

The new system has the benefit of allowing persons working shifts, remotely and those not regularly available to claim a date when they are available. The disadvantage was that at the start and end of the season there were insufficient numbers on certain dates, especially Patrol Captains. In addition, each separate patrol then had to be entered in Surfguard. Sometimes the person had not done their re-qualification, or it had not yet been processed and thus the Surfguard system would not allow the name to be entered. Yet the name had been entered in the google doc. This required a lot of follow up. In addition, it meant that on some

patrols there was not a broad range of skills and little use of the IRB. The new opt in roster system will again be used in the 2025 season.

The Club also provided water safety for the highly successful Darwin Open Water swim on Casuarina beach on Sunday 11 August 2024, contributed to the Beer Can Regatta and some members are part of the SLSNT SAR (search and rescue) team.



Overall, members logged 893.5 hours patrolling this season, with 17 members logging over 20 hours on patrol.

- Commence a self-paced program to complete the full bronze course, or
- Stay as a valuable land-based patrolling member.

Director of Finance Report

On behalf of the Board of Directors for 2024, I present the Financial Statements of Darwin Surf Life Saving Club Inc, for the Members consideration and acceptance.

The 2023/2024 accounts have been audited by TDH Chartered Accountants. Refer to the Auditors Letter and Audited Financial Report at the rear of the Annual Report.

The financial Profit and Loss outcome for the year resulted in a surplus of **\$73,449**.

The Club continues to maintain a relatively healthy balance sheet with total equity being **\$914,986**.

The Club's cash position is relatively strong, as of 30th November 2024 the cash position is **\$272,655**.

Overall, the club is financially sound as reflected in the audited financial statements, however costs need to be constantly monitored in order to consolidate our position and capitalise on grant expenditure for ongoing club improvements and member equipment.

To summarise, our major areas of income for the club as indicated in the Profit and Loss report are:

- Bar income and sale of goods \$164,723
- Function income \$131,828
- Rental income (café and training room) \$17,795
- Membership fees \$14,984
- Darwin Ocean Swim \$23,327
- Grant income \$40,000
- SLSA Beach Safety Equipment Fund \$10,000
- Cost recovery café electricity \$28,371
- SLSA investment account \$20,014

The Northern Territory Government continues to provide strong support to the Club via the Community Benefit Fund. Similarly, the ongoing support from Surf Life Saving Australia provides assistance through the Beach Safety Equipment Fund. Both of these grants contributed to the purchase of the new Side by Side Vehicle for the club in 2024.

Macarthur River Mining (MRM) renewed their generous annual five-year commitment of \$10,000. This significant support along with our other long term loyal sponsors (refer to page 9) provides the club with much needed funds to both sustain and improve our facilities and support our volunteers.

There were significant improvements undertaken and equipment purchased to enhance club facilities including:

- New Side by Side Vehicle
- Second hand tractor
- Two new fridges
- Plant décor for training room
- Cooking equipment for volunteers
- Upgraded doors and windows
- Upgraded fire exits

Often unrecognised are the contributions of all our volunteers whose effort if costed and translated to the balance sheet would amount to several hundred thousand dollars annually.

We also further acknowledge Westpac as a national major partner of Surf Life Saving for their significant sponsorship towards the Westpac Lifesaver 1 Offshore Rescue Boat, the oldest civilian search and rescue service in Australia. A number of our members volunteer around the year to operate these services.

Thank you to our Functions Co-ordinator Tash Chan, Administrator Alison McLay and Book-Keeper Carrie Turner for their services.

Finally, thanks to my fellow board members for their support throughout the year, it has been a productive year, improving our financial control and formalising our administrative processes. To our members and partners, please continue to support our club so we can continue to support the community

event with thousands of competitors taking part and quite the spectacle.

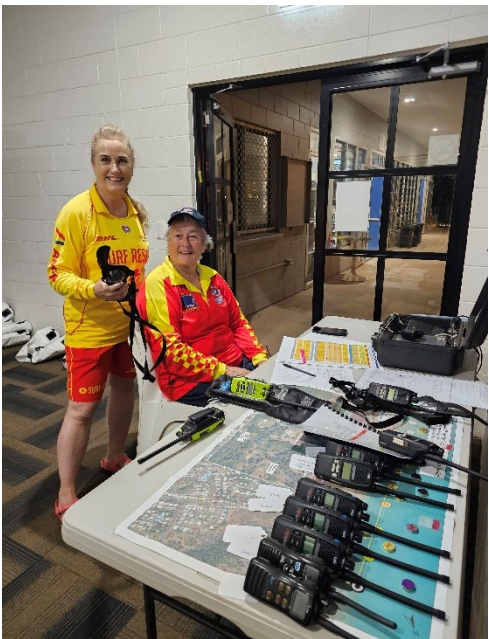

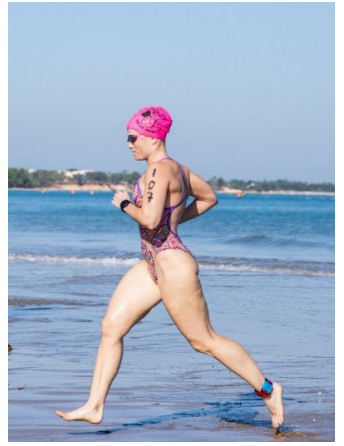
